Our Psychiatry Residency Program, established in 2018, offers a four-year ACGME accredited program with eight or more competitive PGY-1 positions available each year. As Program Director, I bring experience in both undergraduate and graduate medical education along with an outstanding faculty specializing in clinical medicine and education.

In our program, Psychiatric sub-specialties are well represented including Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Geriatric Psychiatry. The residency program is housed at the Pavilion, a 68 bed psychiatric care unit located adjacent to the main medical center. Residents work on established, well-staffed inpatient units with a wide variety of patients and pathologies. They also treat patients in a fully renovated outpatient clinic and a dedicated partial hospital and intensive outpatient program providing services for approximately 30 adults. Additional spaces within the building include offices, resident sleep rooms, a resident lounge and a large classroom with state-of-the-art audiovisual support. Residents will also work in the main medical center and will have access to all HCA facilities on the campus.

An integral part of our program is the nearby Salem Veterans Affairs Medical Center which is a tertiary referral center within the VA system for mental health services and houses robust inpatient and outpatient settings with experienced faculty who are engaged in clinical training and research. Additional educational opportunities exist through training at nearby Catawba Hospital, a state hospital serving adults and geriatric patients, and outreach services throughout southwest Virginia.

Psychiatry residents will embrace a rich community-based program supported by a dedicated and knowledgeable faculty. As an added bonus, residents will thrive within the beautiful region that boasts a vibrant, diverse local culture, friendly atmosphere, and award winning public school systems. He is currently employed as the Medical Director and Chair of the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Health at LewisGale Medical Center in Salem Virginia where he also directs the psychiatry residency program and works with multiple residents and students.






About the Program

Mission Statement

Program Aims

- 1. To produce competent psychiatrists capable of independent practice in a variety of practice settings with diverse patient populations and pathologies.
- 2. To train residents in an environment that values and stresses the concepts of ethical and professional practice of medicine and to produce psychiatrists who will exemplify those principles.
- 3. To produce psychiatrists with the knowledge and expertise to understand and utilize collaborative relationships with other professional services and colleagues in promoting excellence in the provision of care for their patients.
- 4. To produce psychiatrists who are well versed in an integrative model of care, emphasizing the contexts of general medicine as well as other professional fields that are often associated with the care of patients with psychiatric disorders.
- 5. To provide residents with the ability to develop and demonstrate strong didactic and clinical skills that promote the incorporation of scholarly activity into the ongoing practice of evidence based psychiatry and the establishment of a life-long learning model of professional practice.
- 6. To encourage residents toward participation in community and professional organizations in order to serve the educational needs of their local community and public and to serve as an advocate for excellence in mental health care.

Rotation Schedule

Psychiatry residents at LewisGale Medical Center complete their required rotations at our main medical center as well as affiliate locations:

- **Catawba Hospital:** A Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Disability Services facility which houses a diverse population of patients including those both civilly and criminally committed with diverse psychiatric pathologies. Residents are exposed to populations of patients with a wide variety of pathologies with emphasis on patients with chronic mental illness.
- Salem Virginia Veterans Affairs Medical Center: A tertiary referral center within the VA system VISN 6 for mental health. The facility houses robust inpatient and outpatient settings with experienced faculty who are engaged in clinical training and research. Additionally our VAMC faculty are trained in a variety of specialty areas including geriatrics, addiction and other sub-specialties. Residents rotate on multiple clinical services and also have the opportunity to participate in a variety of didactic and other scholarly activities at the VAMC including ongoing research.





 Virginia Tech Cook Counseling Center: The Cook Counseling Center is the primary mental health service located on the campus of Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University (Virginia Tech) and covers a population of over 32,000 students. A diversity of psychiatric, substance use disorder and counseling services are provided to students at this facility. Residents provide care to the student population utilizing multiple modalities of treatment and have the opportunity to interface with a variety of other treatment providers. The site also serves as a training site for a PhD Clinical Psychology program and residents often share patients with other providers in training. Residents are routinely trained in a variety of treatment modalities including medical management, crisis intervention, group psychotherapy and individual psychotherapy. Residents are primarily supervised by two experienced, board certified psychiatrists who are employed by the University.





- Smith Mountain Lake offers boating, paddle boarding, jet sking, and many other water activites













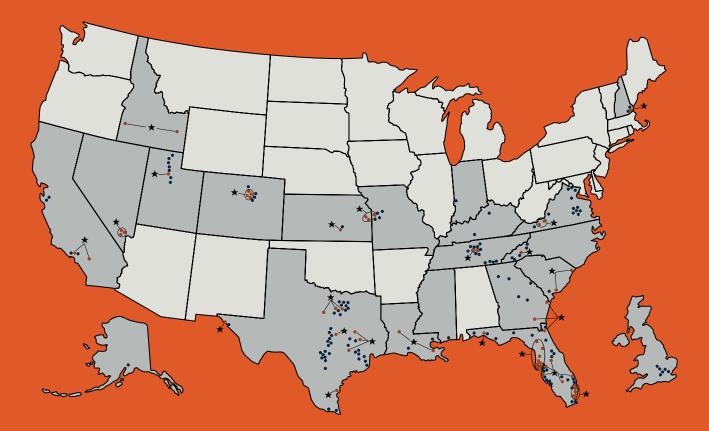

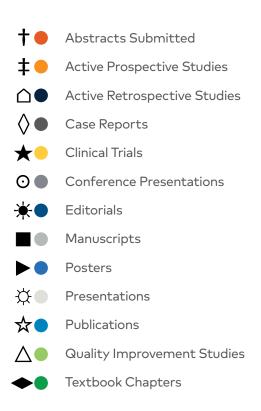

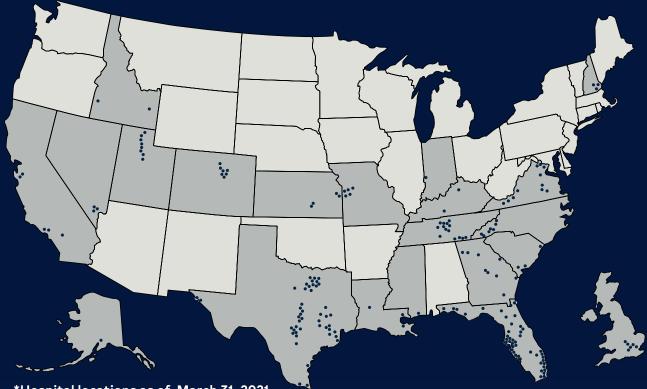
